

It is a rare event when a dive emergency is a single event. More often than not, separate small problems compound to create a larger problem.

Learn how to recognize possible dive related injuries and provide emergency oxygen first aid.



Advanced Oxygen First Aid for Scuba Diving Injuries

Learn to use the MTV-100 or a Bag Valve Mask (BVM) while providing care for a non-breathing injured diver.



First Aid for Hazardous Marine Life Injuries

Learn how to recognize specific types of marine creature injuries and the general first aid treatment for those injuries.

Prerequisites:


Participants must hold current CPR and First Aid certifications from a recognized agency (EFR, AHA, ARC, MFA, etc.) and be certified divers.
