Dear BADDies,

To finish our “Meet the Board” feature, here are the Communications Director, Membership Director and our two at large board members.

Patrick Newman, Communications Director: My wife (yep, see below) and I started diving in 2011, under the instruction of our very own Bill Jones. I’ve since earned my AOW Nitrox, and a couple of other certifications, and look forward to Rescue Diver. Wreck diving is fascinating, and diving the USS Oriskany last June was definitely one I will remember. I got to dive the C-53 wreck in Cozumel last April, and am hoping to dive it again this November when Cindy and I visit Cozumel off the Carnival Magic. Local diving at Mammoth Lake somewhat satisfies my wreck diving thirst. My favorite Caribbean diving is in Grand Cayman. I can’t wait to dive the USS Kittiwake the next time we make it to Cayman.

Cindy Newman, Membership Director: Married to the guy above, Cindy has kept him as a dive buddy all over the Caribbean. She also earned her AOW and Nitrox certifications, and is still on the fence about taking the Rescue Diver course. Her favorite dive locations are the Blue Lagoon locally and Roatan in the Caribbean.

Pee Wee Dwire, Board Member: (Presented here in Pee Wee’s own words) My name is Rodney Dwire, but most people either call me “PeeWee” or “Captain Fly”. I have been diving since late 1978. I have been a member of Bay Area Divers since the 80’s, except for a three year hiatus.

I have dived inland lakes, the Caribbean, the FL Keys, and the Gulf of Mexico off the Texas, Louisiana, and Alabama coasts. My primary passion is spearfishing. Most of my diving has been in the Gulf from many small boats (from 18 to 110 feet).

I trained on CCR’s [closed circuit rebreathers] in ’96

but believed them to be unnecessarily dangerous, so I redirected my interests. I started diving trimix for my deeper dives beginning in ’99 but never certified in this field.

I retired my last Gulf boat (a 25’ Boston Whaler, Frontier model) a few years ago because the motors had gotten too old (1983 vintage) to be considered reliable for the distances went out. I have found it hard to justify the expense of repowering the boat at my age (67 years young). Few Gulf boats still carry divers but I’m game if you find one.

Sandy Benigar, Board Member: (Presented here in her own words as well) I’m Sandy Benigar, married to Rusty Benigar. I’ve been swimming and snorkeling my whole life. I don’t dive due to a medical condition, but I do love to frolic in the water. I’ve been a member of BAD for more than 2 years. Rusty and I have made diving/snorkeling trips to Cozumel, Grand Cayman, Jamaica and Nuevo Vallarta as well as many places in the US. I just love the water and love the opportunity to help others learn about how much fun diving is.

Members of the Month:

Our April Member of the Month was **Donna Contenta**. Donna Contenta always wondered what was underneath the water when boating so she decided to find out. She became certified in June, 1982, and dove locally for several years. She then drifted away from scuba until last year, when her daughter got involved with Bay Area Divers. Her husband had been an active diver for years through his job, so Donna decided it was time to get back in the water. She has a cruise planned to the Virgin Islands in October and will do some diving then. In the meantime, she’s been familiarizing herself with the equipment and is back in the water diving locally. To her, Bay Area Divers means a chance to meet a lot of great people and to have a lot of good times.

Our May Member of the Month was **Judy Thompson**. Every month BAD highlights the diving experiences of one of its members. In a change of pace, BAD looks at the water experiences of one of our visitors to the May meeting, Judy Thompson. Judy is not a diver, but does enjoy snorkeling while her husband adds to his 30 plus years of diving experience. Her two favorite places to snorkel are Hawaii and the Caribbean.
